

Digital Workflow CDT Specialty FAQs

> Is this a new certification program or a new CDT specialty?

Digital Workflow will be a new CDT specialty within the existing CDT program. Once this specialty is launched, there will be seven specialties recognized by NBC – Ceramics, Complete Dentures, Crown & Bridge, Digital Workflow, Implants, Orthodontics, and Partial Dentures.

> What will testing entail?

Candidates will need to take and pass all three CDT examinations in order to become certified in Digital Workflow (Written Comprehensive/Recognized Graduate examination, Written Specialty examination in Digital Workflow, and the hands-on Practical examination in Digital Workflow).

> What are the eligibility requirements to obtain a CDT in Digital Workflow?

Eligibility requirements will be the same as obtaining a CDT in any of the specialties and are as follows:

- Have a working knowledge of the English language
- Be a high school graduate (or the documented equivalent)
- Be of satisfactory ethical and legal standing as defined by the NBC's disciplinary standards
- Meet the technical prerequisites required for testing

> When can I get started?

Candidates may sit for the examinations in any order and all three examinations must be passed within four years of the date that the first examination was passed. With that said, candidates can begin the process by taking the Comprehensive examination as soon as they are ready.

- When will the Digital Workflow Written Specialty and Practical examinations be available? The Digital Workflow Written Specialty examination is expected to launch in the 3rd quarter of 2023; the Digital Workflow Practical examination is expected to launch in the 4th quarter of 2023.
- > What will the Digital Workflow examinations cover?

> How much does it cost to obtain a CDT in Digital Workflow?

The Comprehensive/Recognize Graduate examination and Written Specialty examination will be \$255 each; the Practical examination will be \$595. The Foundation for Dental Laboratory Technology offers a CDT Pillar Scholarship at <u>www.dentallabfoundation.org/pillar-scholarship</u>.

 I am already a CDT. Can I still get certified in Digital Workflow? Certainly! Current CDTs can earn an additional specialty by passing both the Written Specialty and Practical examinations in a given specialty.
